Harold Taylor Award – Alison Lush

CHAPTER NEWS

Terms for Chapter Executives

This policy has recently been amended. It previously stated "The term of Executive Committee members shall be two years from the date of the election or of having volunteered. No member may hold the same Chapter Executive position for more than two consecutive terms (four years)."

This has now been revised to read: The term of Executive Committee members shall be two years from the date of the election or of having volunteered, **except for the Past chair role**, **which will be a one-year term with the option to continue for a 2nd year if needed.** No member may hold the same Chapter Executive position for more than two consecutive terms (four years).

The Chapter Handbook has been updated to reflect this change and is available on the Chapters tab of the Members Downloads & Guidelines page.

Goal: Reduce any intimidation of walking into a room full of professionals when you are just starting out and feel you may not know enough.


Solution: Pairing and introducing the guest directly with a member of the executive as a first point of contact for future networking and answering any questions they may have.


