Topic: Recap of Leadership Forum from Conference

Format: Facilitated & Interactive

We will start with a small talk about formal vs informal leadership, specifically Subject Matter Expert's (SME's). At conference we broke into groups of 6-7 and each group took one of these five questions.

- 1. When a volunteer joins your chapter, what things are done to help them learn their new role? What did you find helped the most to learn the new responsibilities when you joined the chapter executive?
- 2. How does your chapter deal with inappropriate posts on the Chapter Facebook page? What have you found to be most effective?
- 3. If your chapter has had an excess of funds, what types of things has the executive decided to put the money towards? What was your favorite and why?
- 4. What types of speakers have been most successful at your chapter meetings and PD Days? If you had no limitations, who would you bring in to speak at your next event or meeting, and why?
- 5. What do you find is most rewarding about serving on your chapter executive? What do you find most discouraging?

I would ask the attendees to review these questions prior to and bring their answers to the November 27th Chapter Chat. We will review the answers from the Leadership Forum and add any new answers to those already given. Once they are compiled I will forward them to the Chapter Chairs to discuss at the next executive meeting.

Trained Professional Organizer Exam



SOCIAL MEDIA

October saw some great growth within our POC social media platforms (Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest and Instagram). Our **Instagram** account is still seeing increased growth every month! - Email images to sociationmarketing.com
- Include your social media handle, business name and the words "BEFORE" or "AFTER" in the image filename and in the email message (attribution will be given within the post content)
- Only send one image of Before and one image of After per email
