ETHICS CORNER

DID YOU KNOW?

Has a client ever asked you to complete additional tasks outside of the originally agreed upon terms of the signed contract? Upon receiving your invoice for the additional work, has the client then demanded you provide a discount, or worse, refused to pay at all? This phenomenon is so common that it has a name: Scope Creep. Not all clients who participate in this behaviour are disingenuous, but a major ethical implication of 'Scope Creep' is that a client can devalue your work to the extent that you end up working for free. Additionally, if you hired subcontractors to

perform the extra work, you are obligated to pay them for their time, but are unable to recoup the extra costs from the client.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Be aware of clients adding in small requests that gradually build up. If you sense that your client is practicing 'scope creep', make sure you're upfront and honest with the client about the additional costs involved or better yet, consider sending your client a 'Change of Scope' contract. Having a difficult conversation early on is easier compared to further down the line when you are potentially out of time or over budget.

FINANCE NEWS

CHAPTER TREASURERS

Treasurers and Chapter Executives, please ensure that budget discussions have started at your Chapter Executive meetings. Similar to the budgeting process for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, there will be uncertainty surrounding our ability to meet in person for at least some of the new fiscal year. A budget is for planning purposes, based on historical facts and assumptions about the future. Make the best assumptions you can based on anticipated pandemic restrictions in your part of the country.

There is a Chapter Chat scheduled for Wednesday May 26th at 8:00 p.m. ET

specifically for Chapter Treasurers. New Treasurers will be introduced to the Financial Template used to prepare budgets, track revenue and expenses and prepare the Mid -Year and End of Year Report that you will submit to National. For Treasurers returning to their role, a few changes and updates will be introduced. I hope to be providing you with a templated power point presentation that you can add your Chapter information to and present your mid -year and end of year results to your membership. Additionally I will be preparing a Reference Document detailing your role, responsibilities and tasks as Chapter Treasurer. Looking forward to seeing you on the 26th.

CHAPTER GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

Professional Organizers in Canada carries various types of insurance to ensure we are adequately protected should the need arise. *General liability insurance coverage*.is in place for all Chapters. Chapters share 50% of the annual costs associated with this coverage. To date, each Chapter has shared this cost on a flat rate basis. After considering Chapter feedback about this method, the POC Board has made the decision to allocate the cost of insurance on a *per member basis rather than as a flat rate* for each Chapter. For clarification, each Chapter will pay a sum that is based on the total membership of their Chapter per quarter. Larger Chapters will see an increase in the amount of insurance expense and smaller Chapters will see their insurance expense decrease. You will see this difference *reflected this quarter* in your Chapter Split payment and explained in the accompanying letter. As always, feel free to reach out with any questions.


The **Twitter** audience grew a little with 5 new followers since last month, and saw 5,694 tweet impressions, 422 profile visits, and 8 mentions.
