ETHICS CORNER

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

This summer, the Ethics Committee read Alexandra Carter's book "Ask for More: Ten Questions to Negotiate Anything". What does negotiating have to do with professional organizing you ask? Usually a client will contact you, you tell them your rates, you perform the work, and money is exchanged. However, negotiating goes beyond just monetary transactions and formal business discussions. At its core, negotiation is any conversation in which you are steering the relationship. You will get more value by asking the right questions of the person you are negotiating with than you ever will by arguing with them. Negotiating is an essential skill that can add value to your personal and professional life. Carter offers a simple yet powerful ten-question framework for successful negotiation known as "The Mirror" and "The Window".

MIRROR	WINDOW
My definition of the problem/goal	Their definition of the problem/goal
What's the problem I want to solve?	Tell me
My needs/what those look like	Their needs/what those look like
What do I need?	What do you need?
My feelings/concerns	Their feelings/concerns
What do I feel?	What are your concerns?
My previous successes	Their previous successes
How have I handled this successfully in the past?	How have you handled this successfully in the past?
My first steps	Their first steps
What's the first step?	What's the first step?

Before you enter any negotiation or conversation, take thirty minutes to first ask yourself the five "mirror" questions. Clarifying the goal you are trying to achieve is the starting point for every good negotiation. Conversely, the key to negotiating a great deal is to see the other party clearly. To achieve that you need to ask the five "window" questions and then listen empathetically.

DID YOU KNOW?

"Tell me..." is the ultimate open-ended question. You can ask the other person to share anything they want. This is the perfect negotiation starter because it allows you to get the most information possible by getting someone else's perspective on the problem or goal. It is kind of like putting on another pair of glasses.

increase of 4 followers over last month's numbers. There were a total of 2,204 impressions in September.


Pinterest
